Antisense and other oligonucleotides are commonly used tools in molecular biology and other experimental disciplines. As a result of their potential for the treatment of various human diseases, oligonucleotides have emerged as promising drugs for future therapeutic applications. The primary aim of this review is to present a clear overview of new developments in the development of polymeric delivery systems for antisense oligonucleotides.
